

CAP Camp TA Positions Available

Camps

- **Skinner Middle School Camp:** This 3-day camp hosts 15-20 7th and 8th grade students from Skinner Middle School at CAP, with an introduction to architecture and small hands-on projects.
 - Hours will be approximately 9am – 4pm
 - June 6 – 9, 2022

- **[Architecture in the City:](#)** The week-long- day camp will give participants the opportunity for a hands-on experience in model building and drawing techniques while exposing them to architecture, landscape architecture, urban design, and urban planning. For most students, this is their first exposure to architecture and design. This day camp will be offered at CAP during the day, Monday - Friday.
 - Hours will be approximately 8:30am – 5pm
 - June 12 – 16, 2023

- **[ACE Summer Camp:](#)** This week-long overnight camp invites 30-36 high schoolers from ACE Mentor Program affiliates all over the US to participate in a design build project while exploring the fields of architecture, engineering and construction. These students already have exposure to the ACE fields and have worked on projects through ACE. This overnight camp is run out of CAP, with students staying in the City Heights dorms, Saturday – Saturday.
 - Hours will be approximately 8:30am – 5pm
 - Session I: June 24 – July 1, 2023
 - Session II: July 8 – 15, 2023

Responsibilities

- Facilitating groups of students in carrying out learning tasks and design build activities designed by the instructor; work one-on-one with students.
- Helping teach and lead sessions and activities as designated by instructors.
- Assisting instructors in the preparation of classes.
- Preparing and organizing materials as requested by the instructor.
- Other duties assigned.
- Maintaining a safe, inclusive, supportive and fun environment for all students.
- Assisting students with issues and concerns.

Desired Skills and Qualifications

- Strong organizational and communication skills.

- Experience in design software such as Rhino, Revit, Sketchup.
- Experience with the Fabrication Lab.
- Be in good academic standing.
- Must be able to work as a team member and the ability to accomplish tasks with little direct supervision.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Have completed at least 12 credit hours at the baccalaureate level by the start of camps.
- Be a degree-seeking College of Architecture and Planning student, either undergraduate and graduate level.

Pay and Hours:

- \$19/hr
- Hours will be approximately 6-8 hours/day between 8:30am – 5pm (see camp details above).
- 2-4 hours of paid training and preparation hours before the start of camps.
- Ideally hired TAs will work all or most camps, but will hire and work with each individual's schedule as needed.
