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The High Line Canal

- 71-mile linear park with over 850 acres of land
- Constructed in 1883 as an irrigation canal
- Owned by Denver Water since 1924
- Passes through 11 governmental jurisdictions
- Jurisdictions have user agreements to maintain the recreational portion
- Plan to re-purpose the Canal for storm water to ensure its future as a recreational green way and an environmental refuge


High Line Canal

Problem

- Local jurisdictions are increasingly responsible for maintaining and improving the Canal
- There is no singular source for data on the Canal, making it difficult to access information and make decisions
- It is unclear which jurisdiction is responsible for maintaining assets along the Canal

Solution

A data repository that houses a variety of datasets, maps, and other useful information on the Canal


